- Commissioned Corps officers are not members of the U.S. armed forces, but are considered active duty officers.
- The Corps serves on every public health front delivering clinical and humanitarian care and protecting national public health security.
- Public health officers serve on the frontlines in the Nation's fight against disease and poor health conditions responding to the health needs following natural disasters, providing health care to underserved populations, and conducting cutting edge medical research.
